By adding a meta tag in the head statement of your page, you can incorporate transitions much like we do in multimedia programs. I have found that this works nicely in Internet Explorer but not in Netscape at this time. There is no harmful effect to the page displayed in Netscape. Hey, you're reaching half of the audience, anyway!

The code must have capital letters as shown, and no additional spaces. There is no space between the equal sign and the open quotation mark. This code would present a five second transition of a growing circle when the page is opened.

The list of transition codes follows:

- 0: shrinking box
- 1: growing box
- 2: shrinking circle
- 3: growing circle
- 4: wipes up
- 5: wipes down
- 6: wipes right
- 7: wipes left
- 8: right moving stripes
- 9: downward moving stripes
- 10: right moving boxes
- 11: downward moving boxes
- 12: dissolve screen
- 13: horizontal curtain closing
- 14: horizontal curtain opening
- 15: vertical curtain closing
- 16: vertical curtain opening
- 17: left-down wipe
- 18: left-up wipe
- 19: right-down wipe
- 20: right-up wipe
- 21: horizontal bars dissolve screen
- 22: vertical bars dissolve screen
- 23: random effect
